Since COVID-19, the FBI has seen a 300% increase in reported cybercrimes, including ransomware campaigns requiring payment in cryptocurrency.

The **U.S.'s Colonial Pipeline was hacked** in April 2021 via a VPN lacking multi-factor authentication. Meat production was disrupted in June 2021 after hackers successfully attacked JBS.
