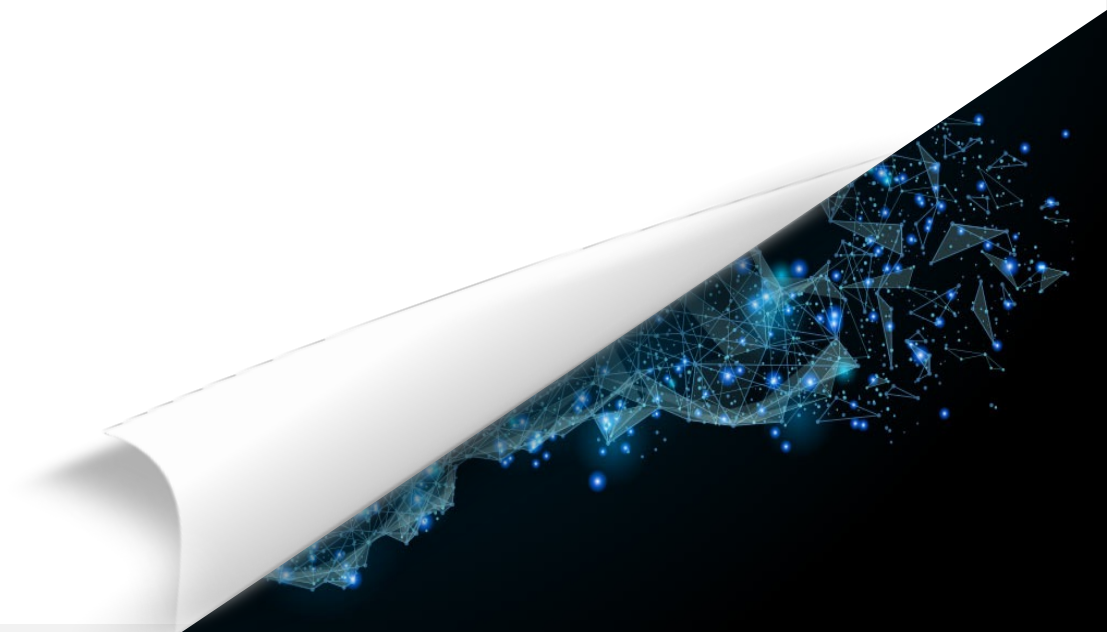

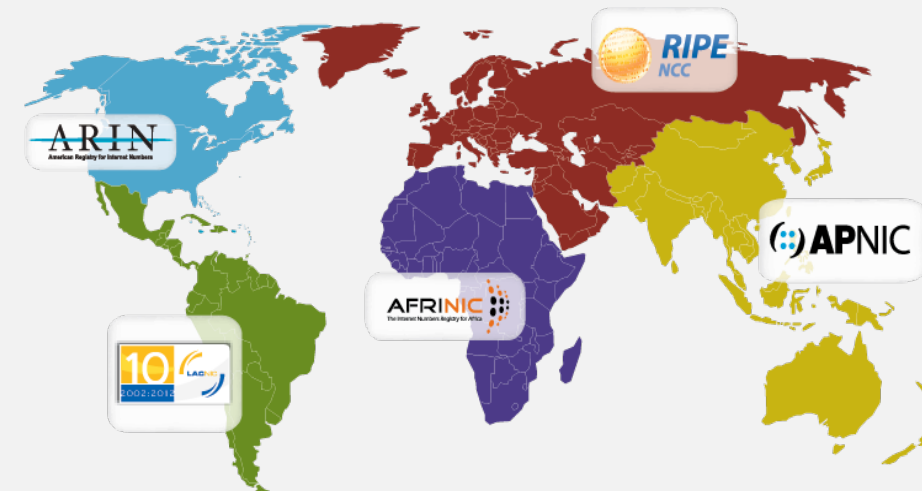


Evolving Internet Developments

The American Registry for Internet Numbers (ARIN) is one of 5 Regional Internet Registries (RIR), that **serve the global Internet community.**

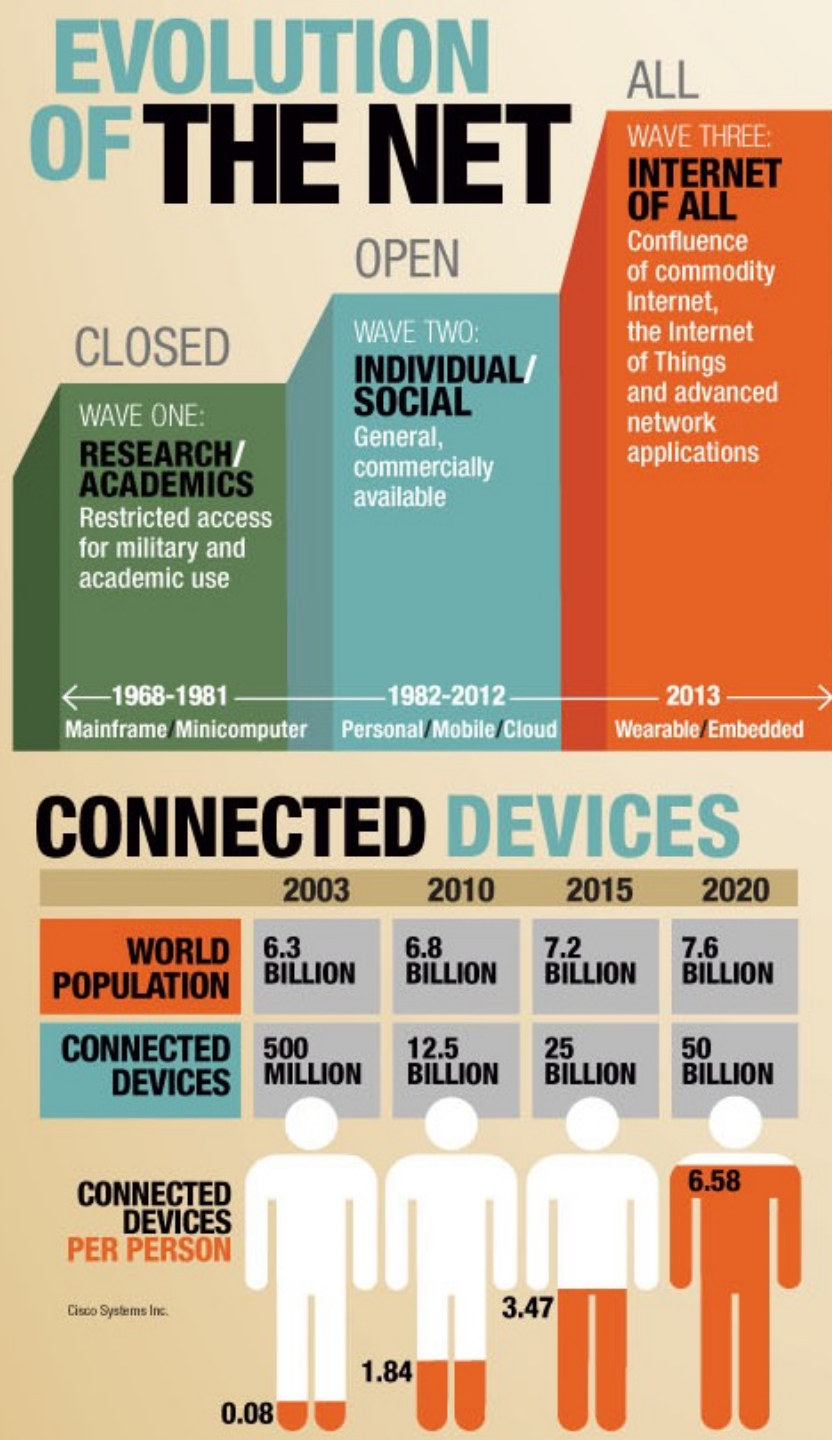
The RIRs are referred to collectively as the Number Resource Organization (NRO), whose **mandate is to actively contribute to an open, stable and secure Internet**

- It is now now the foundation modern development, underpinning social, economic development and global order.

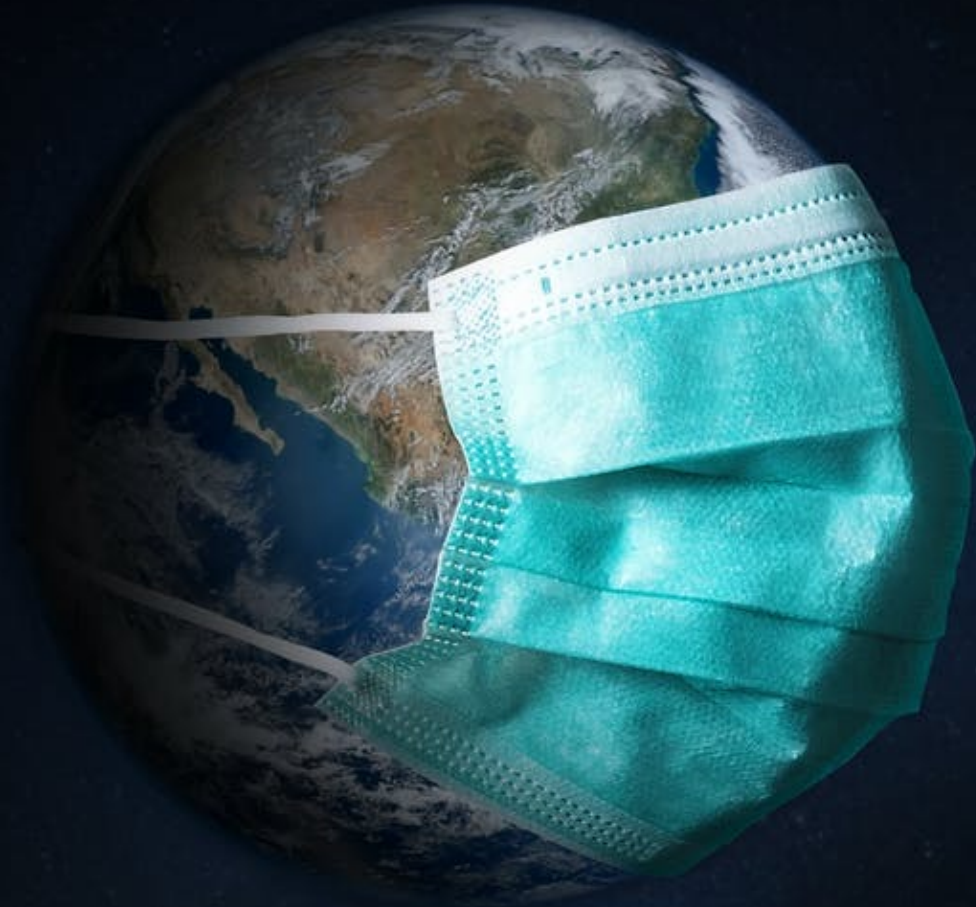

Since COVID-19, the FBI has seen a 300% increase in reported cybercrimes, including ransomware campaigns requiring payment in cryptocurrency.



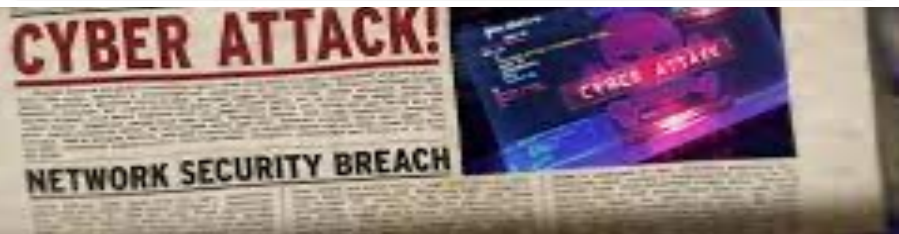
Physical Infrastructures Targeted



The **U.S.'s Colonial Pipeline** was hacked in April 2021 via a VPN lacking multi-factor authentication.



Meat production was disrupted in June 2021 after hackers successfully attacked JBS.

RANSOMWARE EXPANDS

Almost **10%** of organizations detected ransomware activity last quarter. Malicious ransomware like WannaCry can scale-out to hundreds of organizations across the world at once.

46.9%

Decrease in email threats from Q2 to Q3

47.4%

Increase in malicious URL hits from Q2 to Q3

80% of organizations reported high-or critical-severity exploits. Distribution was consistent worldwide, likely due to fully automated tools that methodically scan the Internet for opportunities.

REAL or FAKE?

80% of middle schoolers mistake sponsored content for real news

3 in 4 students can't distinguish between real and fake news on Facebook

Fewer than 1 in 3 students are skeptical of biased news sources

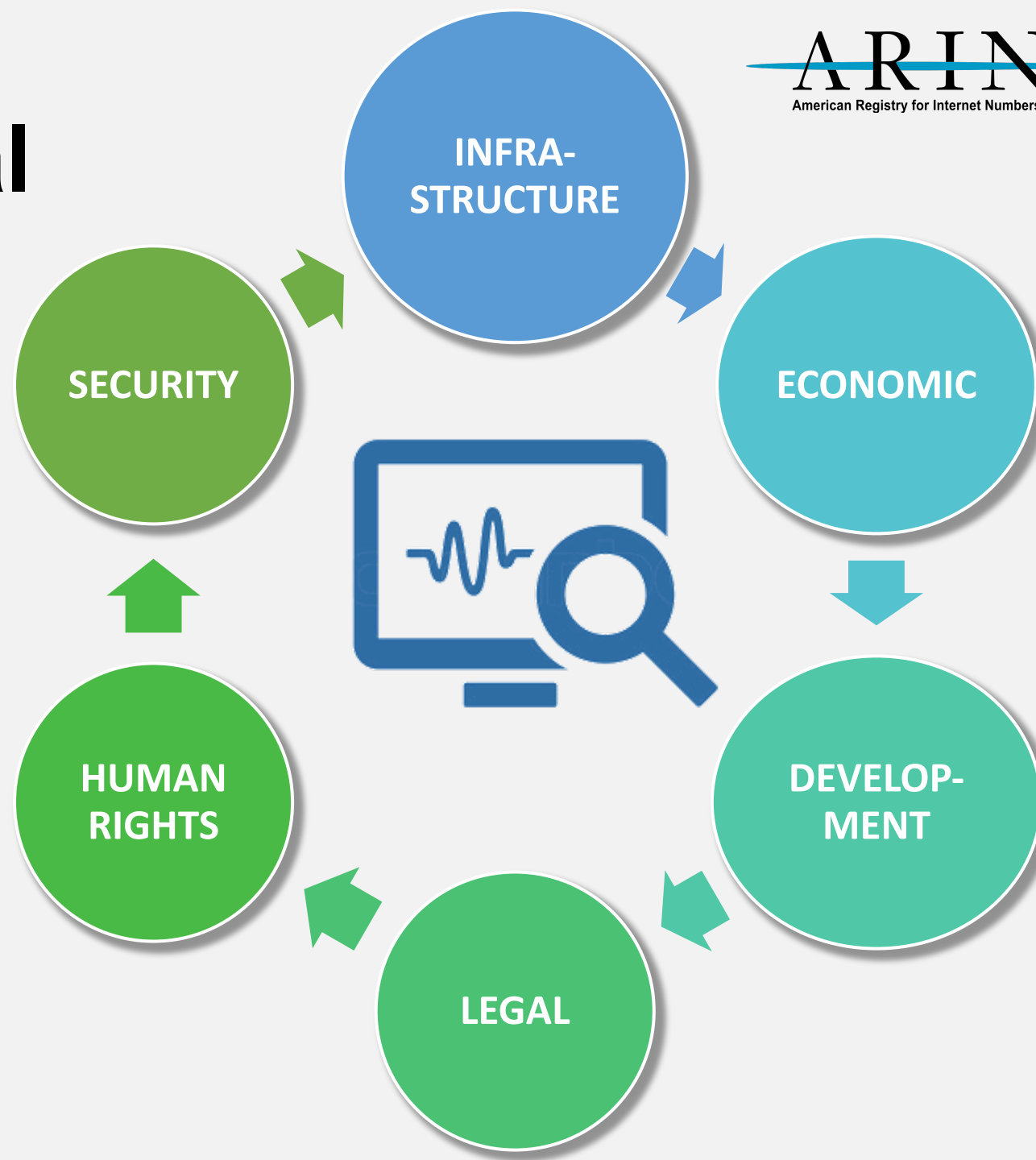
