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Guiding Principles for Caribbean Spectrum Management (2005 to Date)

- Truly regional in scope
- Responsive to changing technological environment
- Effectively functional governance structure
- Multi-stakeholder representation & participation
- Education of stakeholders
- Collaboration with regional and international ICT organisations
- Ensuring continuity and synergy among activities

Harmonisation Objectives

- Regional regulatory harmony
 - Consistent with Single ICT Space
- Regulatory certainty
 - Facilitate & sustain investment and viable competitive markets
- Enable economies of scale
 - Facilitate via multi-country operation
 - Facilitate cost effective roaming
- Minimise national resource requirements
 - Best practices sharing
 - Expertise and resource sharing/pooling

Harmonisation Challenges

- Different locations on the transition road
- Different goals, motivations, momentum to date
 - Work already done
 - Decisions already made
 - Implementations in train
- Assorted regulatory frameworks and institutions (single or multiple regulators, independent or not)
- Resources and funding
- Time constraints
 - national demands, windows of opportunity

CTU Spectrum Harmonisation Work

- Undertaken through the institutions of the:
 - Caribbean Spectrum Management Steering Committee (SMSC)
 - *5 Government policy-makers from 5 Member States*
 - Caribbean Spectrum Management Task Force (SMTF)
 - *Policy-makers, regulators, service providers, academics, technology developers*
- Producing policy and technical guidelines NOT legal mandates

Strategic Vision & Mission for Caribbean Spectrum Management

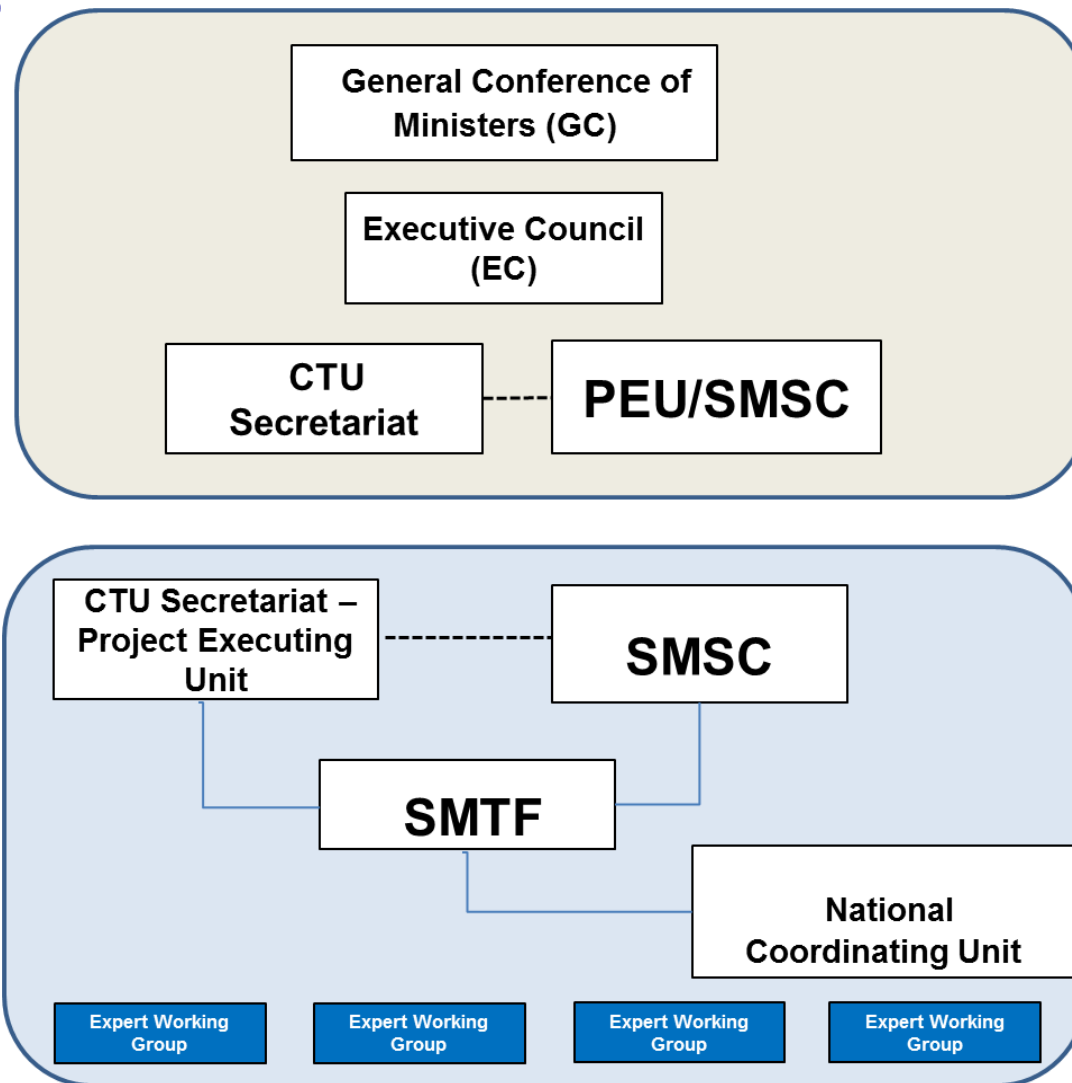
Vision:

A globally influential, Caribbean spectrum management regime.

Mission:

To build a regionally cohesive, technically efficient and sustainable spectrum management regime that proactively meets the region's requirements for broadband and socio-economic development and supports the establishment of a Single ICT Space in the Caribbean.

Streamlined within the existing institutional structure of the CTU.

Status of SMSC and SMTF

- All 5 SMSC nominees for 2020-2022 are now clarified (JCA, T&T, SKN, BLZ, CYN)
 - Chair and Vice-Chair to be determined
- SMTF successfully reconstituted for 2020-2022:
 - Chair : ECTEL
 - Vice-Chair: Jamaica

Current Work Status (1 of 2)

- SMTF work now guided by annual Action Plans to address current/evolving priorities and incomplete aspects of the strategic plan 2016-2018
- 2 SMTF online meetings held so far for 2021
 - Feb 22 & 24 and Jun 29
 - A third planned for Nov 2021
- Executing SMTF Action Plan 2021

Current Work Status (2 of 2)

- Action Plan 2021 addresses:
 1. Regional harmonization of national frequency allocation tables and of priority band plans e.g. 5G
 2. Cross border interference coordination agreements
 3. Emergency communications: policy initiatives and spectrum harmonization
 4. Spectrum pricing: Fostering common pricing approaches
 5. Preparations for WRC-23
 6. Planning the switchover to digital broadcasting
- Created Working Groups of the SMTF to address items 1,3 and 4 above

Future Plans

- Sustain the regional coordination via the Spectrum Management Task Force and Steering Committee
 - Convene meeting of the Steering Committee
 - Facilitate meetings and action plans of the Task Force
- Enhance efficiency of Task Force processes
 - Especially in the absence of project funding
- Promote implementation of strategic provisions nationally
- Sustain relevant valuable collaborations
 - e.g. with ITU, CANTO, CITEL, technology researchers & developers, users and other stakeholders
