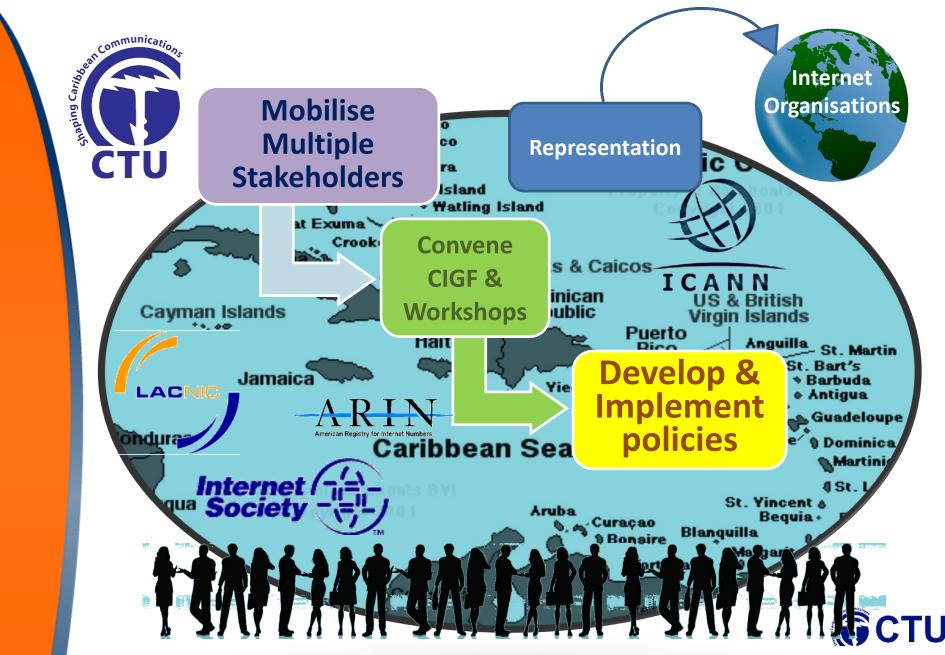


CTU's Goals for IG (since 2005)

- 2005: Requested to address IG issues in the context of the Caribbean's input to WSIS
- Regional policy formulation and harmonisation
- Identify & focus on Caribbean priority issues
- Promotion/Acceleration of Internet development and use in the region
 - Project development
 - Capacity building

Caribbean Internet Governance: 2005-2021

- 17 Annual Caribbean Internet Governance Fora
- 4 Caribbean Ministerial Seminars on IG
- Harmonised Caribbean Internet Governance Policy Framework - 3 issues (2009, 2013, 2016)
- 23 Sessions on IG Technical and Policy Issues in 18 countries with ISOC, ARIN, ICANN, LACNIC, PCH, NIC.PR among others
- 1 South School on Internet Governance
- Multiple Caribbean IXPs and 3 National IGFs to date
- On-line CIGF <u>www.ctu.int</u>
- 18 IXP workshops in 14 Caribbean countries continuing
- IPv6 Adoption on-going
- Indigenous Content Creation on-going
- New Business models for the Internet economy on-going

Focusing on the Caribbean IG Policy Framework

Strategic Priority Areas (w/policy recommendations)

Infrastructure for Connectivity	Access, connectivity (broadband & narrowband, Fixed & wireless), QOS, regulatory matters
Internet Technical Infrastructure	Addressing, domain management, critical Internet infrastructure, technical standards
Legal Frameworks / Enforcement	National & regional structures for protecting users' safety, rights, property
Internet Content	Information management, local content
Public Awareness / Capacity Building	ICT4D, local and regional expertise development
Research	Measurement and status reporting

CTU's Current IG Action Priorities

- Updating the Caribbean IG Policy Framework document
 - Vision, Mission, Guiding Principles, Strategic Priorities, Policy Recommendations and Operational Considerations
- Growing and strengthening national IGFs & communities in the Caribbean:
 - to promote implementation of IG policy recommendations at national and regional levels
 - to enhance Caribbean capacity, participation and influence in global IG policy formulation
- Working to achieve <u>sustainable</u> multistakeholder arrangements for CIGF work e.g. CIDF
- Leveraging partnerships to advance achievement of objectives



Recent IG Events & Issues

- 70th & 71st Public Meetings of ICANN (ICANN 70 & 71)
 - 2021 March 22 25 & June 14 17
 - CTU participates in the proceedings of ICANN's Governmental Advisory Committee (GAC) as an Observer Member where the main GAC issues include:
 - subsequent procedures for new gTLDs
 - RDS/WHOIS and data protection
 - DNS abuse mitigation
- Annual ARIN/CTU Policy Forum
 - 18th & 19th May 2021
 - Explored themes of connectivity, digital inclusion & digital transformation
- 17th Caribbean Internet Governance Forum (CIGF)
 - 24th & 25th August 2021 (Virtual for the 2nd straight year)

Current IG Actions Status

- 17th CIGF (2021):
 - Theme: Caribbean IG Priorities for Post-COVID-19 ICT-driven Development
 - progressed updating of the IG policy framework in areas of connectivity, cyber security and content management
 - also explored policies for affordable meaningful connectivity and digital identity systems
- Reestablished online discussion forum on CTU web site to facilitate inter-sessional work progress on:
 - Updating the Caribbean IG Policy Framework document
 - Routine operational issues e.g. re ICANN matters, policy debates, liaison issues, events etc.
- Re-evaluating the viability of the current CIGF strategy for achieving <u>sustainable</u> multistakeholder arrangements for CIGF work

- 72nd Public Meeting of ICANN (ICANN 72)
 - 2021 October 25 28, Los Angeles time zone
- Issuing the report of the 17th CIGF
- Stimulating and sustaining inter-sessional discussion and policy development progress via the online discussion forum to expedite Issue 4.0 of the Caribbean Internet Governance Policy Framework
- Contributing to the proceedings of the 16th UN IGF in December 2021 in Katowice, Poland
