## **World Radiocommunication Conference (WRC)**




- Update the Radio Regulations, the international treaty on the use of radio spectrum and satellite orbits
- Bring together all stakeholders in a process that is aimed at building consensus
- Provide a stable and predictable regulatory environment needed for future investments
- Enable new radiocommunication systems and applications to access the radio spectrum
- Protec the operation of existing radiocommunication services
- Ensure the rational, equitable, efficient and economical use of the radio-frequency spectrum and satellite-orbit resources
- **Examples of WRC-19:** 4 weeks, 3 420 participants ,163 administrations, 129 other entities (including industry), 29 agenda items and issues, 568 documents, 5 811

## World Radiocommunication Conference (WRC)



- Updates the Radio Regulations (CS\* 89) (treaty status)
  - Spectrum Allocation
  - Coordination and Notification procedures
  - Administrative and operational procedures



- Adopts Resolutions
- Held every 3-4 years (CS\* 90)
- Additional provisions in CV\* and GR\*

- Main goals of the RR:
  - interference free operation of stations
  - harmonization of spectrum/orbit use

## Role of ITU-R in preparation to WRC's



- ITU-R Studies development of technical and regulatory basis for WRC decisions
- SG develop international standards (recommendations), reports, opinions and handbooks on Radiocommunication matters
- Examples of steps in study process:
  - ✓ determining spectrum requirements (derived from traffic estimations)
  - ✓ technical and operational characteristics of radiocommnucation systems
  - ✓ studies of compatibility between new and existing applications
  - ✓ identification of candidate bands, regulatory solutions
- ITU-R consists of 6 SG, composed by 21 Working Parties (WP)

### ITU-R Study Groups:

- SG-1: Spectrum management
- SG-3: Radiowave propagation
- SG-4: Satellite services
- SG-5: Terrestrial services
- SG-6: Broadcasting service
- SG-7: Science services


