The EU-LAC Digital Alliance is an informal, values-based framework for dialogue and cooperation, open to all Latin American and Caribbean (LAC) countries and EU Member States who may participate through their respective governments and agencies related to the digital agenda.

Under that umbrella there are already an overarching regional initiative based on four pillars:

- Pilar 1 EU LAC High-level Policy Dialogues on Digital Policy and Regulations, in areas such as Connectivity, Data Governance, E-Governance, AI and cybersecurity
- Pillar 2 increased secure connectivity and bringing the research communities of the EU and LAC closer – Red Clara
- Pillar 3 **regional Copernicus Strategy** including two regional Copernicus data centers in Panama and Chile for earth observation to address societal challenges.
- Pillar 4 the EU-LAC Digital Accelerator aiming to foster joint ventures and collaboration between EU and LAC corporations, SMEs and innovative start-ups. The objective is to facilitate and accelerate at least 40 joint ventures for bi-regional innovation and digital transformation.

- **Cybersecurity:** LAC and EU cybersecurity frameworks are better aligned and more effectively enforced to provide safe digital space for all citizens, business and governments.
- **Connectivity**, EU and LAC collaborate in implementing innovative policies and strategies to achieve inclusive and secure connectivity
- **E-Governance;** Development of interoperable digital identity mechanism within LAC and between EU-LAC,
- Data Governance improved free and safe flows of data,
- **AI:** EU and LAC are better prepared for the AI revolution, mitigate risks and seize its potential opportunities.
- **Caribbean** specific target on sub-regional initiatives and mechanisms, as development of a Cybersecurity Toolbox, supports the legal & regulatory needs, a regional coordination of issues at the sub-regional level to facilitate cooperation with EU and rest of region, knowledge transfers, peer-to-peer exercises and access to experts and e-Governance.

First follow-up dialogue on cybersecurity in February 2024 will be hosted by the Dominican Republic, with follow-up dialogues on connectivity and digital inclusion, data governance and e-governance to take place later in the year.

Governments and their agency are being directly consulted and contacts through the EU delegations (EEAS) and DG INTPA in Brussels
