Addressing the digital divide in the Caribbean

- Closing the Caribbean's digital divide could increase the region's GDP by 6% to 12% in the medium term.
- ▶ Potential payoffs from investing in digital infrastructure are considerable: range from 2 to 50x
 - the deployment of 5G in the EU by 2025 is estimated to yield EUR 1 trillion in new GDP,
 - ▶ EUR 2 trillion in new sales,
 - and the potential to create / transform 20m new jobs. Similar figures in the US.
- A regional approach is fundamental to achieve these goals and harness the potential of the digital economy and society, and not just for the economies of scale (i.e. satellite connectivity, data centres, high performance computing)



The EU offer to the region: The Digital Alliance



An informal coordination framework- endorsed by the Heads of State that promotes the joint interest of both regions working together on digitalisation.



A human-centric approach, where Governments regulate and businesses innovate, but data security and citizen protection are at the centre.



Working together in the digital transition, with the leading standard setting region in data protection and data governance, regulation of artificial intelligence, deployment of electronic ID systems, and development of cybersecurity capabilities.



A package that combines "soft" and "hard" elements of policy coordination, technical assistance, business to business support and investments in connectivity for the Greater Caribbean.



Support to develop inter-operable frameworks, common standards, cyber-security protocols, etc...

High-Level Policy Dialogues

EU-LAC High-level Policy Dialogue on Digital Policy and Regulations bring together LAC and EU policy makers at high-level and demand-driven regional policy dialogues, to build consensus and partnerships on digital policy and regulatory matters.

- ▶ Cybersecurity, Dominican Republic, February 2024
- Artificial Intelligence, Uruguay, March 2024
- eGovernance, Costa Rica, May 2024
- Data Governance, Uruguay, October 2024
- ▶ Connectivity and Inclusion, Chile, November 2024
- ▶ Artificial Intelligence, Chile, November 2024



EU-LAC Digital Accelerator

- Offers business accelerator services to joint ventures established between EU and LAC companies.
- Specific carve-out for the Caribbean, targeting 100 firms with EUR 40k each in individual support.
- ▶ The objective is to connect digital projects with relevant public and private investors to financially enable them.
- It offers a key match-making service between Caribbean startups and EU corporate firms.



BELLA Cable

- ▶ 35.000 km of submarine fibre-optic cable connecting LAC and the EU.
- ▶ Connecting Higher Education and Research Networks, bringing unprecedented opportunities for scientific, cultural and business exchanges.
- ▶ Facilitating the sharing of high-performance computing and Earth observation data between Europe and LAC.
- ▶ Public-private partnership of stakeholders, with the EU as the largest investor.



Regional COPERNICUS Centres

- ▶ 2 centres established and operational in Panama and Chile.
- ▶ Transferring skills, expertise and competitive EU space-related digital services to LAC countries.
- ▶ Satellite Earth Observation can make a difference addressing challenges like climate change, border controls, and disaster risk management.
- Specific user cases in development to offer both public and private sector.

Established in the Dominican Republic to provide expertise in cybersecurity and cybercrime to support LAC's operational and transformation efforts.
