

CTU's Goals for IG (since 2005)

- 2005: CTU requested by CARICOM Secretariat to address IG issues in the context of the Caribbean's input to WSIS.
- Regional policy formulation and harmonisation.
- Identify & focus on Caribbean priority issues.
- Promotion/ Acceleration of Internet development and use in the region
 - Project Development
 - Capacity Building



The CIGF is...

- World's first and longest running regional IG Forum.
- A non-hierarchical multi-stakeholder forum that is <u>convened</u> by the CTU
- Focused on:
 - harmonising IG policy regionally
 - addressing IG matters of priority to the Caribbean
- A pathway to influence policy-makers of the Government stakeholders in the Caribbean.
- More than just a preparatory meeting for the other IGFs.
- Enhancing synergies with global IGF and LACIGF e.g. promoting national multistakeholder mechanisms.

Achievements from CTU's IG Activities

- Now 20 CIGFs, 3 Caribbean Youth IGFs and 4 Ministerial Briefing Sessions on IG.
- 4 Issues of <u>Caribbean IG Policy Framework</u> (2009, 2013, 2016, 2024).
- At least 23 Sessions on IG Technical and Policy Issues in 18 countries with ISOC, ARIN, ICANN, LACNIC, PCH, NIC.PR among others.
- Hosted 1 South School of Internet Governance (2014).
- 18 IXP workshops in 14 Caribbean countries plus the recent CaribIX project with French Caribbean territories (St. Martin, St. Barthelemy, Guadeloupe).
- Contributed to regional and global IGF proceedings.
- Multiple IXPs and at least 3 NIGFs in the Caribbean to date.
- Guideline documents re IPv6 conversion and IXPs, Caribbean Cyber-security Framework.
- Signed MoUs establishing partnerships to further CIG agenda.



CIGF Challenges

- Improving attention to/visibility of IG at the national and Governmental levels- temporary change with COVID-driven thrusts to digital transformation.
- Limited reach and impact of the regional work at the national level; sometimes a disconnect between regional and national initiatives.
- Lack of capacity/organization nationally to benefit fully from the CIGF and to address and advocate on national IG issues;
- Insufficient capacity of the persons working in the area to represent their countries at international Internet fora or to execute IG related activities; and
- Multiplicity of uncoordinated interventions.



Current Approach for Caribbean Internet Governance



- Collaborate with regional/international Internet & ICT orgs.
- Foster, support and utilise local communities of interest...
 - ISOC Chapters
 - National IGFs
 - Task Forces
 - Advocacy groups
 - Computer Societies



Current Approach for Caribbean Internet Governance




...to execute IG activities at national level.

- Progressive awareness and education campaigns for different audiences.
- Advocacy for regional consensus policies.
- CIRTs/CSIRTs.
- ccTLD strengthening/development.
- Implementing projects e.g., re cybersecurity, IXPs, IPv6, DNSSEC, Spam Control etc.

Caribbean IG Outlook for the Future

- Continue thrust towards national IGFs & communities.
- Work with Caribbean stakeholders to promote implementation of IG policy recommendations at national and regional levels.
- Pursue <u>sustainable</u> multi-stakeholder arrangements for CIGF work e.g. appropriate coordination mechanism(s).
- Continue to enhance linkages with other IGFs.
- Continuously review and agree priority IG issues for the Caribbean going forward.
- Leverage online modes to enhance process of ongoing collaboration.
- Develop CIGF effectiveness metrics to gauge progress and success
