# SETTING PRIORITIES FOR ACCESSIBLE COMMUNICATIONS@SEA SOLUTIONS FOR SMALL-SCALE FISHERS

under the ITU/CTU/TATT Smart Seas Toolkit for Disaster Resilience ("Smart Seas") Project

**WORKSHOP PLAN | 11 & 12 MAR 2024 | 09:00 - 16:30 (AST)** 

The Setting Priorities for Accessible Communications@Sea solutions for Small-scale Fishers Workshop is an activity under the Smart Seas Toolkit for Disaster Resilience ("Smart Seas") Project, which sets out to co-develop a tiered list of priorities by an international, multi-sectoral, multi-stakeholder community to reduce risks associated with inadequate access to communications at sea for small-scale fishers (SSF). This two-day hybrid workshop will be held at the Hyatt Regency in Trinidad and Tobago, and will serve as working group session, to consult with stakeholders on the output report, titled *An Agenda for Accessible Comms@Sea for SSF* (Agenda Report), for future publishing to the international community.

#### **Background**

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO 2020)¹ recognizes fishing as one of the most dangerous professions, recording over 32,000 deaths annually. SSF are often exposed to numerous risks out at sea including, but not limited to, piracy and inclement weather. Information and communications technologies (ICTs) may aid SSF in communicating with national authorities, family and other seafarers when in danger, and receiving life-saving information such as meteorological warnings and forecasts. However, existing ICTs may not be suitable to SSF's needs. This calls for the development of a structured approach to enable accessible, fit-for-purpose comms@sea for SSF.

Though the Smart Seas Project focuses on the countries within Trinidad and Tobago's Maritime Rescue Co-ordination Center's (MRCC's) jurisdiction: Barbados, Grenada, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, its outputs are intended to be replicable internationally and as such collaboration among international agents and agencies is necessary to formulate a global approach to reduce risks associated with SSF's inadequate access to fit-for-purpose communications.

# **Objectives**

The Setting Priorities Workshop's objectives are to:

- 1. Consult with stakeholders on the gaps and gap-filling solutions to accessible comms@sea for SSF
- 2. Identify priorities to enable accessible comms@sea for SSF
- 3. Reach consensus regarding publishing of the co-authored output, *An Agenda for Accessible Comms@Sea for SSF* Report

## **Outputs, Outcomes and Impacts**

The output of this Workshop is An Agenda for Accessible Comms@Sea for SSF. The intended outcomes of the workshop are:

- The formation of a loose, global community that considers technological, service and market innovations to address SSF access to comms@sea solutions
- An improved enabling environment to foster the development of innovative and accessible communications solutions to improve SSF's safety and livelihoods
