ITU World Telecommunication/ICT Indicators Symposium (WTIS-25)

DATE & VENUE

The 20th edition of the ITU World Telecommunication/ICT Indicators Symposium (WTIS-25) will take place in Geneva, Switzerland, from 22nd to 23rd September 2025. Under the theme "WTIS@20: The past, present and future of digital development statistics".

What is WTIS?

• The World Telecommunication/ICT Indicators Symposium (WTIS) is organized by the Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU).

• The Symposium takes place annually and is targeted at those responsible for ICT statistics in relevant ministries, regulatory agencies, national statistical offices, telecommunication operating companies, as well as experts in the subject of information society measurement.

• First held in 1996, and annually since 2005, WTIS has evolved to become the key global forum to discuss telecommunication/ICT measurement issues.



Key Objectives of WTIS:

- The objective of the Symposium is to debate new and emerging issues on ICT data and statistics and their role in policy making.
- To **provide strategic guidance** to the international community on information society trends and future monitoring.
- It also develops standards and methodologies for producing high-quality data and statistical indicators.
- It provides the forum for coordination of the global ICT statistics agenda for the collecting and disseminating vital information and conducting world-class research, supporting evidence-based decision making towards universal and meaningful connectivity and sustained digital transformation.

Persistent & New Challenges:

- Ongoing difficulty in measuring universal and meaningful connectivity due to the rapid evolution of digital technologies.
- Resource mobilization, overcoming infrastructure gaps, and developing innovative financing models
- A persistent lack of data availability and quality.
- the complex governance of emerging risks like AI misuse and market concentration.



ITU 16th Meeting of the Expert Group on Telecommunication & ICT Indicators (EGTI) and 13th Meeting of the Expert Group on ICT Household Indicators (EGH)

DATE & VENUE

- The 16th EGTI will be held in Geneva, Switzerland, from 24 to 26 September 2025.
- This year the meeting is held back-to-back with the 13th EGH and the 20th World Telecommunication/ICT Indicators Symposium (WTIS-25).
- For the first time, the third day will feature a dedicated in-person workshop for practitioners. This hands-on session will offer EGTI and EGH members a unique opportunity to exchange experiences and share good practices in data collection,

Importance of EGTI & EGH

- ITU develops international standards on ICT statistics through its Expert Groups which are open to the ITU membership and to experts in the field of ICT statistics.
- The outcomes of the Expert Group on Telecommunication/ICT Indicators
 (EGTI) and the Expert Group on ICT Household Indicators (EGH) are submitted
 to WTIS for adoption.
- EGTI & EGH develop and update statistical indicators and standards for Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) to ensure international consistency (standardization), comparability, and relevance in the field of ICT statistics – Globally shared and reliable understanding of digital trends
- Comprehensive Data: EGTI and EGH cover both the supply-side (telecommunications) and demand-side (household use) aspects of ICTs, providing a complete picture of digital development.
- EGTI & EGH defines what to measure & how to measure it.

Why Your Attendance Matters?

- Strategic Guidance: Guidance on information society trends, measurements and future monitoring., helping shape international priorities for ICT measurement.
- Influence Policy and Strategy: The outcomes of discussions at WTIS provide strategic guidance to the international community, helping to define future work priorities for ICT measurement. This is particularly important for SIDs with our own idiosyncrasies.
- Access to Latest Data: The WTIS is the launch event for the annual "Measuring the Information Society Report
 provides the latest ICT Development Index (IDI) results and benchmarks ICT development globally.
- **Networking Opportunities:** You will have the opportunity to connect with government ministers, business leaders, regulators, national statisticians, academics, and ICT data experts from around the world.
- Develop Standards and Methodologies: Participant contribute to the process of developing standards and methodologies for producing high-quality ICT data and statistical indicators.
- WTIS offers a unique platform: to access and contribute to international standards, debate emerging issues like AI and Big Data. Sessions often feature high-level discussions on emerging ICT trends like Artificial Intelligence, Big Data, Cloud Computing, and the Internet of Things.

DATE & VENUE

- This Virtual Forum is convened to prepare for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC).
- The IRM-2 will give ITU-D membership the opportunity to engage and exchange views on key issues ahead of WTDC-25 as we work toward consensus building pertaining to the Conference outputs.
- IRMs are open to all ITU-D membership. Member States are therefore encouraged to include in their delegations, representatives from regulators, non-ICT policymakers, academia, Internet technical community, youth, and others as they deem necessary.





ITU 2nd Inter-Regional Meeting (IRM-2)

REGISTRATION & ACCESS

- Delegates can register for the meeting using their ITU user account credentials(i.e. username and password).
- In case they do not have an ITU user account, they can create one by following the steps available HERE.
- A User account with TIES access allows delegates to access ITU information resources including contributions and other working documents.
- All registration requests for participation in IRM-2 must be validated by the Designated Focal Points (DFPs) of administrations and entities entitled to participate. The list of Designated Focal Points is available HERE.

KEY ASPECTS OF AN ITU IRM-2

- WTDC Preparation: The primary goal is to advance preparations for the WTDC a major event for the ITU's telecommunication development sector.
- Regional Updates and Coordination: Expect updates on the progress of regional preparatory meetings (RPMs) and telecommunication development working groups.
- Identification of Regional Priorities: A key outcome is to identify and agree on common regional priorities and initiatives to advocate for during the main WTDC conference.
- Input on Study Groups and Resolutions: The meeting involves reviewing and providing input on study group questions, regional initiatives, and the drafting of resolutions that will be considered at the WTDC.

KEY ASPECTS OF AN ITU IRM-2

• Review of Working Methods: The meetings may also review and propose changes to the working methods of ITU-D study groups and the Telecommunication Development Advisory Group (TDAG).

• **Participation and Influence:** IRMs are designed to facilitate member participation, ensure transparency, and build consensus for effective contributions to the WTDC.

• Virtual Participation: Access to the meeting may be virtual, with information provided to registered participants via email.

• The Accessible Americas: ICTs for ALL event is organized by the Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) in partnership with the Superintendencia de Telecomunicaciones (SIT), the national regulatory authority of Guatemala.

Why ITU Accessible Americas?

- Out of 7 billion people in the world, 1 billion people live with some form of disability.
- Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) are tools that can help to improve the quality of life for all.
- In this context, accessibility means that the user requires to win functional access to ICTs and ensure that such functionality is provided:
 - If you cannot see a typical screen, you need a way of understanding what is displayed on the screen;
 - o If you cannot hear the information, you need a way to obtain that information;
 - If you cannot interact with an appliance, you need a way to do it.

Inclusion, equity and sustainable development are the legs of the table on which any society rests. This led to the genesis of Accessible Americas!!

ITU Accessible Americas – its genesis.

- In November 2014, a magical moment took place in Sao Paolo, Brazil when these urgent needs coincided with a proposed solution "Accessible America Event".
- In the Americas, participants from governments, academia, the private sector, NGOs and other international agencies meet, discuss the issue, raise awareness and find solutions as they build a community in the Americas to improve the accessibility conditions in the region.
- Since then, the Accessible America Event takes place every year in the month of November. This year it is in October due to WTDC-25 in November.

ITU Accessible Americas – what it is.

- Accessible Americas is ITU's leading regional platform dedicated to promoting ICT accessibility and digital inclusion.
- This initiative supports ITU's broader mission to ensure that everyone, everywhere, can access, use, and benefit from digital technologies regardless of age, gender, ability, or location.

- It emphasizes ICT accessibility for all, especially Persons with disabilities, women, girls, indigenous people, youth, and older persons.
- Our work is grounded in a holistic and intersectional approach that recognizes the diversity of needs and challenges faced by various groups in the digital age.

ITU Accessible Americas – Objectives.

- The primary objective of Accessible Americas are:
 - To enhance stakeholders' knowledge of digital inclusion policies and strategies,
 - o foster the sharing of best practices in ICT accessibility, and
 - create valuable networking opportunities.
