- 2. Harmonising spectrum management policies to facilitate new and emerging technologies and services for socio-economic development
- 3. Emergency Communications
- 4. Spectrum Pricing
- 5. WRC-27 Preparations
- 6. Planning Digital Broadcasting Switchover
- 7. Maintaining Current Information for Operational Coordination (to support Cross-border interference coordination and emergency communications)
