CTU ICT Week 2024 - Saint Kitts and Nevis

30th September to 4th October 2024

The Caribbean Telecommunications Union (CTU) hosted CTU ICT Week 2024 in Saint Kitts and Nevis under the theme "*Bridging Technologies for a Sustainable and Inclusive Future*". The event brought together over 200 attendees, including government officials, industry experts and key stakeholders to discuss and advance digital development initiatives in the Caribbean.

Key Discussions

- 1. **Emerging Technology Trends 6G and Beyond**: Experts examined advancements beyond 5G and the Caribbean's readiness for next-generation technologies.
- 2. **Cloud Adoption in Government**: Strategies for implementing cloud solutions in the public sector and regional collaboration were discussed.
- 3. **Digital Inclusion Initiatives**: Emphasis was placed on bridging the digital divide and enhancing digital literacy.
- 4. **Data Privacy in an AI-Driven World**: Discussions focused on AI's impact on data privacy and the need for robust regulatory frameworks.
- 5. **ICT Resiliency Amid Climate Change**: The need to strengthen ICT infrastructure to withstand climate-related challenges was highlighted.
- 6. **Harmonising Digital Transformation Efforts**: The establishment of a regional regulatory unit was proposed to coordinate digital transformation initiatives was communicated.
- 7. Youth Engagement and Innovation: A two-day hackathon engaged St. Kitts youth in software development and innovation.

Statutory Meetings Decisions and Resolutions

Executive Council Decisions/Highlights

The Executive Council approved private sector membership for three companies: **Amazon**, **Google, and Welchman Keen**, representatives from each of which presented at the joint EC-GC meeting.

The **Universal Postal Union (UPU)** also delivered a special presentation on digital initiatives for postal sector modernisation.

- Chair: Barbados (Re-elected)
- Vice-Chair: Grenada (Re-elected)

General Conference Resolutions

- 1. GC30-08.1 SG-Tenure
 - a. The General Conference extended the tenure of the Secretary-General of the CTU for another four-year term (2025-2029), recognising achievements during the first tenure.
- 2. GC30-08.2 Establishment of a Regional Regulatory Body (RRB) for Telecommunications
 - a. The General Conference endorsed the establishment of a Regional Regulatory Body (RRB) for telecommunications and ICT in CARICOM, comprising representatives from regulatory agencies in CARICOM Member States.
- 3. GC30-08.3 Rationalising of ICT Governance in CARICOM Member States and the CTU
 - a. The General Conference called for the rationalising of the mandates of the **CTU General Conference fi Ministers and COTED-ICT**.

General Conference Elections

- President: Trinidad and Tobago (Re-elected)
- Vice-President: Saint Kitts and Nevis (Newly elected)

Elected officers will serve a two-year term until 2026.

CTU ICT Week 2024 reaffirmed the region's commitment to fostering digital transformation, collaboration and inclusive technological advancement to build a resilient and sustainable Caribbean digital economy.

The **CTU ICT Week 2025** will be hosted in **Jamaica from 29th September to 3rd October 2025**. Planning discussions with Jamaica are ongoing.
