TRAVEL & ACCOMMODATION GUIDANCE

Participants are encouraged to utilise the following guidance on Visas, Accommodation and Transport to ensure all necessary arrangements are in place for their comfort and security.

Hotel Booking

Transportation Arrangements

Kindly note that transportation will not be provided between the recommended hotel and the ports of entry. Participants are encouraged to make their own travel arrangements.

For those staying at the Radisson Grenada, one convenient option is to access the taxi service available at Maurice Bishop International Airport or utilize other reliable taxi services operating nearby.

Travel to Grenada

Participants traveling to Grenada require a **valid passport**.

Visa-free entry is available to most visitors to the island. Check your entry requirements [here](#).

Visitors are encouraged to complete the [Grenada Online Immigration Portal](#) document 72 hours before arrival.

All international flights arrive at **Maurice Bishop International Airport (IATA: GND)** at Point Salines, on the southwestern tip of the island. It is a compact, modern single-terminal airport roughly 10 to 15 minutes from the Grand Anse hotel strip and 15 to 20 minutes from St. George's.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Catering	Lunch and coffee breaks will be provided throughout the event.
Dress Code	Business casual or casual attire is acceptable and recommended for most meetings.
Special Requirements	To ensure their specific needs can be accommodated, delegates with allergies, accessibility and/or other unique requirements should contact the various hotels before making reservations.
Language & Interpretation	English is the official language of Grenada. There is currently no interpretation planned for the fora.
Climate	Grenada is a tropical country, seasonally humid. In August, daily temperatures range between 28 – 32 degrees Celsius.
Time Zone	UTC-4 or GMT-4
In Country Mobile Line	There are three popular options to acquire a temporary SIM card during your stay in Grenada. <u>Airalo</u> : A prepaid eSIM card that can be purchased online. Before buying, check if your device is compatible with an eSIM card. Digicel: It is recommended to buy a SIM card directly from the mobile provider store or on arrival to the airport. You can view their prepaid plans here . Flow: It is recommended to buy a SIM card directly from the mobile provider store or on arrival to the airport. You can view their prepaid plans here .
Voltage	230 V ~ 50 Hz Type G plugs and sockets are the official standard (UK-style).
Tipping	Tipping is optional. Most service based establishments, like hotels and restaurants include a service charge automatically. Tipping is viewed as a reward for addition or exceptional service.
Currency & Payment Cards	<u>The Eastern Caribbean Dollar</u> (XCD/EC\$) is the national currency of Grenada. There are bills of 5, 10, 20, 50 and fractional coins of 5, 10, 25, and one dollar. Republic Bank Grenada, Grenada Co-operative Bank, and CIBC FirstCaribbean all give the actual interbank rate (effectively the EC\$-USD peg) with no markup. Most don't add their own operator fee for foreign cards. ATMs are available in St. George's, Grand Anse, Grenville, and Hillsborough (Carriacou). They dispense EC dollars. Most accept Visa and Mastercard with withdrawal limits of EC\$1,000-2,000 per transaction (about \$370-740 USD) Carriacou has limited ATM access in Hillsborough; Petite Martinique has none.

Health	Nearest emergency department: St. George's General Hospital – about 4 km / 10–15 minutes by road, north through St. George's on Grand Etang Road. It is the national referral hospital, open 24 hours, and the only facility near Grand Anse with a full accident and emergency department. A new hospital building opened there in 2024. Ambulance: dial 434, or 911 for police/fire. Switchboard: +1 (473) 440-2051. Nearest private alternative: St. Augustine's Medical Services at St. Paul's – roughly 15 minutes inland. Private, shorter waits, but pre-payment is usually required and costs for visitors can be high. Delegates should check with their insurer before attending. +1 (473) 440-6173. Walk-in clinics within a few minutes of the hotel (weekday daytime hours only, so not an out-of-hours option): Black Rock Medical Centre at Grand Anse Shopping Centre is the closest at about 300 m; Spice Island Medical Center at Spiceland Mall is roughly 600 m and takes same-day bookings; Grand Anse Medical Centre is the public health centre about 1 km south, busy and community-focused. Pharmacies: Health Plus at Galleria Mall is effectively next door to the Radisson; Gittens Health Care on Wall Street and Mitchell's on Grand Anse Main Road are both within walking distance and open into the evening, including limited Sunday hours.
Safety	Grenada is widely regarded as one of the safer destinations in the Caribbean and delegates rarely encounter difficulty, however caution is advised. Personal security The realistic risk to a delegate staying in the Grand Anse corridor is opportunistic theft rather than targeted crime. The following precautions are sufficient in almost all circumstances. • Use the hotel room safe for your passport, laptop, spare payment card and surplus cash. Carry only what you need for the day. • Do not leave bags, phones or laptops unattended – on the beach, at the poolside, or in session rooms during breaks. • Use licensed taxis only. Their registration plates begin with the letter "H" and drivers display official credentials. Agree the fare, and confirm whether it is quoted in EC or US dollars, before setting off. • Withdraw cash in daylight, from machines inside a bank or shopping mall rather than street-facing ones, and not immediately before walking back to your hotel. • In your room, use the deadbolt and do not open the door to unexpected callers. Contact the front desk if anyone claims to be hotel staff without prior arrangement. • Should you be confronted in a robbery, do not resist. Property can be replaced. • Keep a photograph or scan of your passport data page stored separately from the document itself. Road traffic presents a greater practical hazard to visitors than crime does. Roads are narrow, steep and winding, with blind corners, potholes, limited lighting outside main areas, and pedestrians walking on the carriageway. For a stay of a few days, taxis are strongly preferred to self-drive. Grand Anse Beach is generally calm and safe for swimming. Beaches on the Atlantic-facing east coast can have strong currents; swim only where others are swimming. Avoid isolated beaches and unlit areas at night. Heat and sun cause more delegate incidents than any other factor. Drink water regularly, use high-factor sunscreen, and limit midday exposure. Grenada lies in a seismically active zone and, during the June to November hurricane season, may be affected by tropical weather systems. Familiarise yourself with your hotel's evacuation guidance on arrival and follow the instructions of local authorities and the Secretariat in the event of a warning.
